





## 8TH GRADE READING PROFICIENCY & OKLAHOMA DRIVERS LICENSE

Any person under the age of 18 wishing to apply for a drivers' license or permit in Oklahoma shall successfully demonstrate a satisfactory reading ability at the 8th grade level (unless student in on an IEP program). Individuals under the age of 18 who have previously demonstrated reading competency in another state may submit the results of such tests to the State Department of Education for verification and approval. Students who have not passed a reading proficiency test in another state should check with school officials for the next scheduled alternate assessment opportunity.

The Oklahoma Core Curriculum Tests (OCCT) measure student progress toward Common Core State Standards. Scores fall into one of four categories: Unsatisfactory, Limited Knowledge, Proficient and Advanced. Oklahoma Law states that third-graders who score Unsatisfactory in reading on the OCCT must be retained (not promoted to fourth grade). Retention does not mean the student (or the teacher) has failed. The purpose of retention is to give children who have substantial reading deficiencies a chance to catch up. Students who are retained must be given intensive instruction in reading to help them catch up.
