Can We Do a Raffle Fundraiser?

- 1). The Fundraiser request, to include proposed raffle information, must be submitted in advance for Ethics Review.

 Approval must be granted by the Garrison Commander prior to beginning any effort to host/conduct a raffle.
- 2). If approved, a military commander must be present during the drawing of the winning ticket (Oklahoma statute requirement).
- 3). If approved, the maximum number of tickets to be sold should be indicated on each ticket (Example: Ticket #43 of 500).
- 4). If approved, raffle tickets may <u>not</u> be sold on the job (could be offered, if approved, from an area not considered "in the federal workplace". This could include a table outside the bldg., in an outside gazebo area, etc. Cannot sell raffle tickets during Soldier formation, while you are teaching a class, from your office desk, etc).
- 5). If approved, participation in the raffle is truly voluntary (no coercion or compulsion).
- 6). If approved, no off post tickets may be sold to persons not employed by the government. However, family members of government employees may purchase tickets if desired.
- 7). Reminder: Leave and passes or other official benefits will not be auctioned off, raffled off, etc. Groups are strictly prohibited from offering military benefits to individuals involved in fundraising, such as time off, passes, training holidays, or authorized wear of civilian clothes during the duty day as an incentive or reward for their donation or participation in fundraising. Official positions will not be offered for a price, i.e., "Commander for a Day".
