

### Heat Illness-Related Mishaps Claim Soldiers' Lives

A Soldier collapsed after completing the 2-mile run portion of an APFT. He reportedly suffered a medical event while being treated for heat injury and was transported to a civilian medical center, where he was pronounced dead.

Three Soldiers fell out for heat stress while conducting weapons-fire training on the range. One Soldier continued to decline and was air-evacuated for treatment and died that evening. Hyperthermia has been cited as the cause of death.

A Soldier collapsed near the completion of a foot march. First responders applied ice blankets and the Soldier was evacuated to a hospital for treatment of kidney failure and a collapsed lung. His core body temperature was brought to normal, but the Soldier died of cardiac arrest the next day.



### **Severe Weather - Tornados**


**Tornado Watch**: Conditions are favorable or expected but not occurring or imminent. Atmospheric conditions are favorable for the development of severe thunderstorms capable of producing tornadoes. Remain alert for approaching storms. Listen to NOAAWeather Radio, commercial TV or radio for weather information.

**Tornado Warning**: means that a tornado has been spotted, or that Doppler radar indicates a thunderstorm rotation which can spawn a tornado. Stay Informed:

- Signal in Lawton, Oklahoma is a 3-minute siren blast
- KCCU Radio (89.3 or 102.7)



- KSWO-TV (Channel 7) will simulcast
- For those with smart phones, there are numerous early warning applications you can download to your phone to assist in providing early warning of severe weather and warnings



### **Severe Weather - Lightning**

Lightning procedures IAW FS Reg 385-10 Lightning 30 miles away. \*Notify personnel of increased lightning hazard. \*Prepare to cease unnecessary outdoor activity. \*Have nonessential personnel find shelter.

Lightning 15 miles away or thunder heard but no flash observed.

\*Secure outdoor equipment

\*Cease outdoor activities other than securing equipment and critical tasks

\*Personnel not mission essential shall move to hardened shelter

Lightning 8 miles away or flash is observed.

\*Immediate cessation of all outdoor activities, abandon efforts to secure equipment

\*All personnel take cover in hardened shelter, if no shelter is available move to hard top vehicles

\*If on foot find low risk locations and disperse. DO NOT take cover under trees

#### Forces on Vehicles From High Water

The car will be carried when: Buoyancy Force Greater Than Vehicle Weight



There is no friction force once the vehicle is lifted off the road

Nearly half of all flood fatalities are vehicle related

### Swimming/Boating

#### PLR 19-047 - Boating Mishap Claims One Soldier's Life

Posting Date: Wednesday, April 24, 2019 / Categories: Preliminary Loss Reports, Sports & Recreation

A 34-year-old Sergeant First Class assigned to Special Forces Command, Eglin Air Force Base, Florida, died in a boating mishap 14 April 2019 on Joe's Bayou at 1330 local. The Soldier was operating his 20-foot center-console boat when he and his passenger were thrown overboard in rough waters after reportedly experiencing a steering problem. Personal flotation devices were available, but their use has not been confirmed. Alcohol was not associated with the mishap.

#### PLR 19-028 - Boating Mishap Claims One Soldier's Life

Posting Date: Tuesday, February 12, 2019 / Categories: Preliminary Loss Reports, Sports & Recreation

A Sergeant assigned to 69th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, Fort Hood, Texas, died in a boating mishap 21 January 2019 on Belton Lake at 1500 local. The Soldier was fishing with another individual when their boat capsized and he failed to resurface. His body was later recovered.

#### PLR 19-004 - Swimming Mishap Claims One Soldier's Life

Posting Date: Monday, October 29, 2018 / Categories: Preliminary Loss Reports, Sports & Recreation

A Private First Class assigned to Joint Task Force-Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, died following a swimming mishap 16 October 2018 at Cable Beach, Guantanamo Bay, at 1300 local. The Soldier reportedly was overcome by the current while swimming in coastal waters with other Soldiers. He was in Title-10/activated status.

#### PLR 18-091 - Swimming Mishap Claims One Soldier's Life

Posting Date: Thursday, August 9, 2018 / Categories: Preliminary Loss Reports, Sports & Recreation

A 28-year-old Specialist assigned to U.S. Army Europe died in a swimming mishap 6 August 2018 at Riedsee Bei Leeheim, Hesse, Germany, at 1650 local. The Soldier swam with a group to a large inflatable approximately 30-40 meters out, and submerged while returning to shore. He was recovered and transported to a local hospital, where he died from water inhalation complications.



### **SNAKE BITE**

Yellow Border Safety Alert Snake Bite Injury with Amputation

#### Synopsis

While still under investigation, preliminary findings indicate the following: Approximately 2300 on 23 June 2016, SM was fishing near Lake Lawtonka Dam. While walking SM was bitten by an unidentified snake. SM self transported to RACH Urgent Care and was transferred to a local hospital. Hospital ER examined SM and stated that injury was minor as very little venom was injected and placed on 48 hr. quarters.



SM returned to work on 27 June and performed duties as normal with no complications. On the morning of 03 JUL 2016, SM woke up with severe pain and blistering on foot and toes. SM self transported to hospital where SM was treated with anti-venom and steroids. SM underwent surgery to amputate all toes on left foot. SM remains in hospital under observation. Potential exists for additional surgery.

### Fort Sill has experienced 3 Snake Bite injuries, 2 resulting in amputations in last 18 months

Lawtonka Lake is prone to snakes, water moccasins, insects and other wildlife
 Warm weather is a prime time for snakes and other wildlife to be present
 SM was fishing in darkness difficult to see surroundings and potential wildlife hazards
 SM was by himself in a secluded area not heavily traveled during darkness

#### **Recommended Soldier/Leader Actions**

Leaders and supervisors should discuss this safety alert with subordinates reinforcing the importance of maintaining awareness of surroundings and hazards.
 Prior to engaging these types of activities, encourage battle buddy program & ensure personnel notify others of their location where they will conduct the activities
 Disseminate and post this alert on all unit/organization safety boards

**SNAKE BITE** 



#### <u>Synopsis</u>

While still under investigation, preliminary findings indicate the following: Approximately 2300 on 12 July 2016, A Civilian was camping at LETRA while reaching for wood for the campfire the Civilian was bitten on the left hand by a Rattlesnake. RACH EMS transported Civilian to local hospital and received 4 vials of antivenin and is in stable condition

### In the past 18 months Fort Sill has experienced 4 Snake Bite injuries, 2 resulting in amputations

#### Factors

Lake areas and camping areas are prone to snakes, insects and other wildlife

Warm weather is a prime time for snakes and other wildlife to be present

Civilian was camping in darkness difficult to see surroundings and potential wildlife hazards

Snake was in a pile of wood, snakes like to nest under brush, hay and other objects

#### **Recommended Soldier/Leader Actions**

Leaders and supervisors are to brief this safety alert after receipt to all personnel
 Prior to engaging these types of activities, ensure personnel notify others of their location where they will conduct the activities

Disseminate and post this alert on all unit/organization safety boards





#### Synopsis

While still under investigation, preliminary findings indicate the following: On 07 FEB 2015 at approximately 1520 hours, a SM was hiking with two classmates in the Wichita Mountains Wildlife Refuge when a Rattle Snake, described to be 6 to 8 foot in length bit him on his left calf. His classmates immediately called EMS and carried him to the parking lot where he was evacuated by helicopter to Hospital. SM's lower leg was amputated and remains in critical condition.



#### This is first reported Snake Bite injury to a Fort Sill SM in FY-15

#### Factors

- Soldiers were hiking in an approved public use area.
- Wichita Wildlife Refuge is prone to snakes, insects and other wildlife
- Unseasonably warm weather can cause snakes and other wildlife to be active
- · Fort Sill Operations Center was not notified of incident in a timely manner

 Battle buddies were instrumental in getting SM immediate life saving medical care. This could have led to loss of life had individual been there alone.

#### **Recommended Soldier/Leader Actions**

- Leaders should discuss this safety alert with their subordinates.
- Reinforce importance of battle buddy program and educate subordinates on wildlife hazards and maintaining awareness of surroundings.
- Ensure personnel develop emergency action plans prior to conducting activities
- Research area for potential hazards (e.g., Wildlife, Falls, flash floods, severe storms, etc.)
- Disseminate and post this alert on all unit/organization safety boards



**QUESTION**: With the recent rains and flooding, there are mosquitoes everywhere on Fort Sill. I understand we can't control the weather, but I can't let my children out to play without them getting mosquito bites. Is there a plan to spray for mosquitoes, especially in the housing areas?





## SAFETY CONCERN-FREEDOM ELEMENTARY

**Question:** I had a concern about a Freedom Elementary school safety issue, called the non-emergency line recently, and told dispatch that one of the back doors to the Kindergarten lunch gym was not closing properly. I was able to open and close it from the outside. I asked for a call back to close the loop and ensure it was being addressed. The dispatcher called back and reported the watch commander said that I needed to call the schools admin dept "where they fix stuff like that". I did report it to Principal Shanklin as planned, but I hoped reporting to both would create a fail proof follow-up. I tried to call DES using the following numbers from the garrison web site with no success: DES Director - 580-558-6001 - went straight to voicemail, voicemail full DES Deputy Director -580-558-6003 - went straight to voicemail, voicemail full DES Sergeant Major - 580-558-6002 - left a voicemail about a week ago, no call back. I'm concerned that a report of breach in school security left gaps that could lead to children being hurt. Once it's been reported to DES, shouldn't that trigger DES to report it to the proper school authorities and then follow-up to ensure it's been completed? What is the process here?
