Please join us in **congratulating Private Konnor D. Campbell and Military Working Dog Lucky** for becoming the first team in TRADOC to earn a tracking certification through the North American Police Work Dog Association (NAPWDA).

From May 5–9 in Rockwall, Texas, PV2 Campbell and Lucky completed intensive training to track a single human scent across varied terrain—including grass, gravel, concrete, and wooded areas. This skillset is essential in locating missing or hiding individuals and greatly enhances Fort Sill's emergency response capabilities.

Summer Fire Safety on Fort Sill and Surrounding Areas

Prevent Wildfires

- Never leave campfires unattended drown, stir, and feel ٠ before leaving.
- Avoid outdoor burning during dry, windy days. ٠
- Properly dispose of cigarettes never toss on the ground ٠ or out of a vehicle.
- Maintain spark arresters on equipment like ATVs and ٠ lawnmowers.
- Keep a hose, water bucket, or shovel nearby when grilling ٠ or burning.

Red Flag Warnings

- Issued by the National Weather Service for high fire risk conditions.
- Avoid any outdoor burning or activities that create ٠ sparks.
- Follow local alerts and emergency instructions. ٠

for any emergencies

- Violating a ban will result in fines and increase wildfire risk.
- Burn bans will restrict campfires, fireworks, and open flame cooking.

Geothermal Heat Pump Project

The upgrade of 1,707 homes to geothermal heat pumps, water heaters, and thermostats has begun.

- Drilling and trenching is currently underway in Buffalo Soldiers Acres and Southern Plains
- Interior installations to begin 6/2/25
- Installation project will run through 2028
- For the Corvias Portfolio this is an investment of over \$200M to increase the quality of life of soldiers and their families, provide cleaner energy, and to help the Army meet their lower emission goals.

- Q-Anywhere 24/7 now allows for patients to submit their medication requests via text anytime of day. Staff will process requests received after hours at the beginning of the following duty day. Patients can expect a text back once their prescription is ready for pickup.
- ScriptCenter is also accessible for refill pickup 24/7, even holidays. The UCC entrance vestibule will remain open for patients to pickup their refill(s) via the ScriptCenter locker at the time of day most convenient for them.
