We are aware of the SECWAR's April 02, 2026 press release authorizing Off-Duty Service Members to request to carry privately owned firearms on Installations.

Fire Prevention

Red Flag Warnings	Burn Bans
Issued by National Weather Service (NWS)	Issued by local or statewide authorities. Check current bans at: www.forestry.ok.gov/burn-ban-information
High fire risk conditions	Restricts campfires, fireworks, and outdoor burning
Avoid any outdoor burning or any activities that create sparks	Violating a ban can result in various legal and financial consequences

Fire Pits and Open Burning are **Not Authorized** on Fort Sill.

To ensure readiness, live-fire training will be conducted on Fort Sill, even during burn bans. While the training can unintentionally ignite fires, we operate a dedicated, 24/7 fire response team to immediately address any incidents.

Oklahoma Severe Spring Weather

Hazard	Risk
Severe Thunderstorms / Flooding	Disruption to training exercises and daily operations.
	Damage to facilities, infrastructure (roads, bridges, buildings) and utility systems.
	Increased risk of vehicle accidents due to reduced visibility and slick roads.
	Potential for standing water, which can become a breeding ground for insects.
High Winds/ Tornado	Damage to buildings, roofs, and other structures.
	Uprooting of trees and power line damage, leading to power outages.
	Disruption to outdoor activities and training.
	Creation of flying debris, posing a hazard to personnel and property
Lightning	Direct strikes to personnel, leading to severe injury or fatality.
	Strikes to buildings, communications equipment, and other infrastructure, causing damage and power surges.
	Ignition of wildfires, particularly in dry conditions, as mentioned previously.
	Disruption of outdoor training and operations, often requiring personnel to shelter.
Hailstorm	Significant damage to vehicles (dents, broken windshields).
	Damage to roofs, windows, and siding of buildings.
	Injury to personnel caught outdoors.

Fort Sill Considerations

Severe Thunderstorms / Flooding

- Average of about 33” of rain annually
- Region is prone to intense rainfall events, especially in the spring
- March-May generally see increased rainfall activity
- May is typically the wettest month, with a 27% chance of precipitation on any given day
- Flash Flooding: Intense, short-duration rainstorms can lead to flash floods
- Low-water crossing areas on post and low-lying areas in towns
- Storm sewer systems can be overwhelmed by severe events
- [Avoid intersections flooded by water runoff](#)

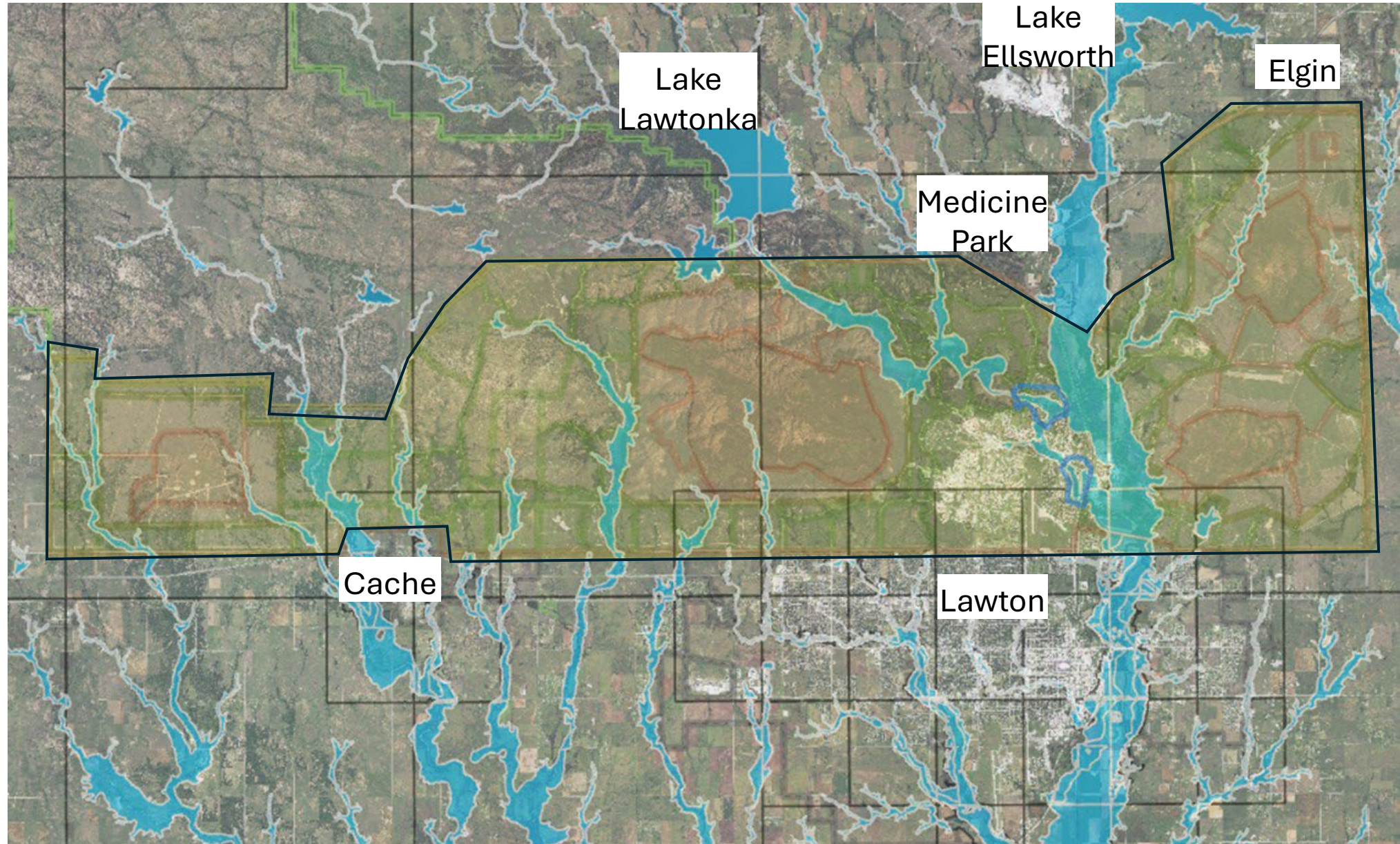
High Winds / Tornadoes

- Secondary hazard of severe thunderstorm systems and events
- Fort Sill does lay in “Tornado Alley”
- Result in downed branches, trees and/or power lines
- Leads to: blocked transportation routes, property damage, power outages, and create electrocution hazards (downed power lines).

Lightning / Hailstorms

- Both are inherent dangers of thunderstorms
- Lightning strikes likely
- 2023 Hailstorm at Fort Sill, Lawton and surrounding area (\$M in property damage)

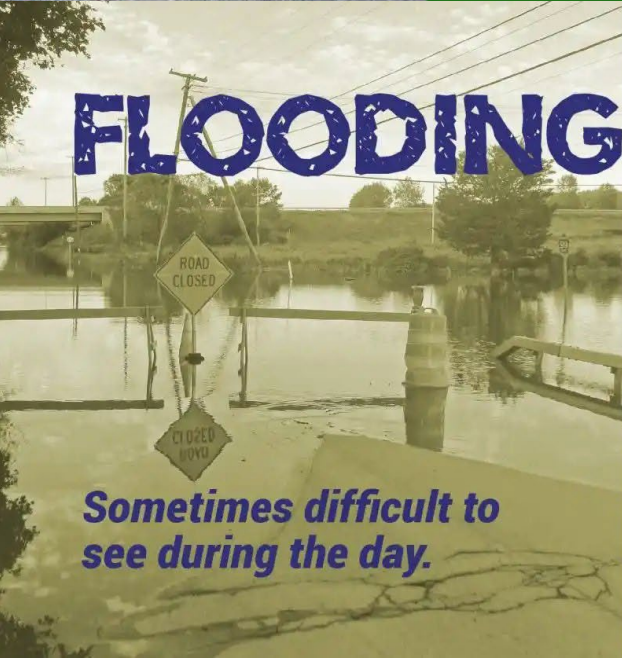

Planning & Preparedness Tips

- Check weather conditions prior to any travel.

Severe weather tips

- Secure loose outdoor items that could become airborne in 70 mph winds.
- Avoid windows and move to an interior room on the lowest floor.
- Be prepared for large hail that can break windows and damage roofs, siding, and vehicles.
- Treat Severe Thunderstorm Warnings seriously, especially when destructive winds are expected.
- If a Tornado Warning is issued, take shelter immediately in a small, windowless interior room.

Local Reporting Requests and Requirements :

- Report any adverse impacts to public safety response capability, governmental services, significant life threats, or damage/compromise to critical facilities to Comanche County-Lawton Emergency Management

Highly recommend signing up for the County Alert system to also receive updated information on storm shelter locations open to the public.

PCS Season –Getting Prepared

- 30-Day Notice is Key:** Remember that you need to give Corvias at least 30 days' notice before you move out. Otherwise, we are forced to charge late notice fees.
- Short Notice Orders:** If you receive your official orders less than 30 days before your departure, ensure they are delivered to Corvias within 5 days of the date on the orders. If received in our office within 5 days, we can waive short notice charges. Otherwise, we may not be able to help and we want to help.
- Don't Wait for Orders to Give Notice:** You don't need your official PCS orders to submit your Notice to Vacate. If you have an expected timeframe of when you'll be moving, it's a good idea to contact Corvias. We can help you create a move-out timeline.
- Schedule a Pre-Inspection:** This is a very helpful step! Contact Corvias to schedule a pre-inspection of your home. This walk-through will help identify any potential damages, some minor repairs you can do yourself to save money and/or set up a repayment agreement that won't put your family in a financial hardship . Plus, it helps Corvias understand which homes might need more time to get ready for the next service member so that we can more accurately assign move in dates for the next family.

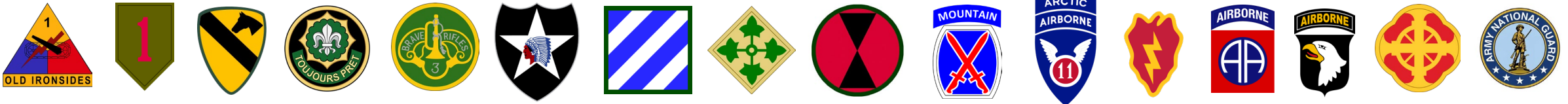

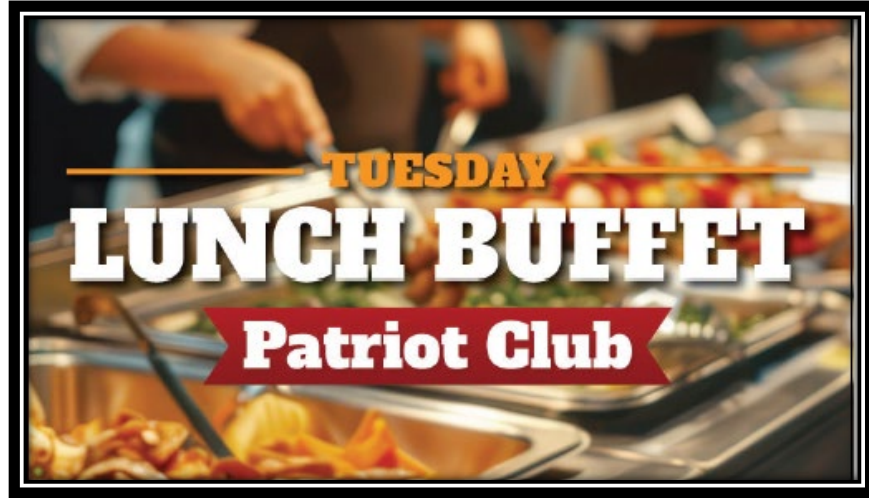
