1. **Expired CACs and Dependent ID Cards:** The responsibility for maintaining valid identification rests with everyone. Supervisors must ensure that employees are held accountable for the expiration of their Common Access Cards (CACs) and dependent ID cards. The resultant loss of productivity is not a burden that can be shifted to the organization.
2. **Lost CACs:** The Army incurred an overspend of \$4 million on CACs last year due to the high incidence of lost cards among service members. It is imperative that units enforce accountability among personnel. The Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC) is exploring mechanisms to impose charges on individuals for lost cards.
3. **Missing Documents:** There is growing frustration among customers regarding missing documents in their records. It is essential to clarify that these records are managed by DMDC, not Fort Sill. We have been directed to update all missing records prior to the issuance of ID cards, and compliance with this directive is mandatory.

Mass Transit Survey

- Logistics Readiness Center and Fires Center of Excellence, is conducting a Mass Transit Transportation Survey to better understand the transportation needs across the installation. The survey requires feedback from Soldiers, families, civilians and retirees to inform us of potential improvements to public transit access, routes and military-specific transportation solutions.
- The results of the survey will be used to identify gaps in current services, assess the demand for transit options and guide future planning efforts aimed at improving quality of life and operational efficiency across Fort Sill.
- For this to work Installation-wide effort is required to maximize survey participation and ensure community members understand how their input directly contributes to transportation planning and decision-making.
- Transportation access directly affects readiness, QOL and community navigation. While public transit options exist in the Lawton– Fort Sill area, participation and awareness vary, and military-specific needs may not be fully understood or addressed.
- Maximum Participation for the Mass transit Transportation Survey is highly recommended as our goal it to achieve at least 1,000 completed responses by the close date of 16 February 2026.

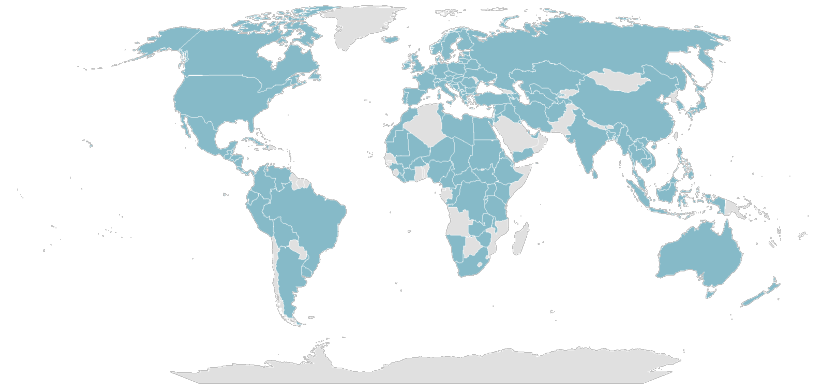



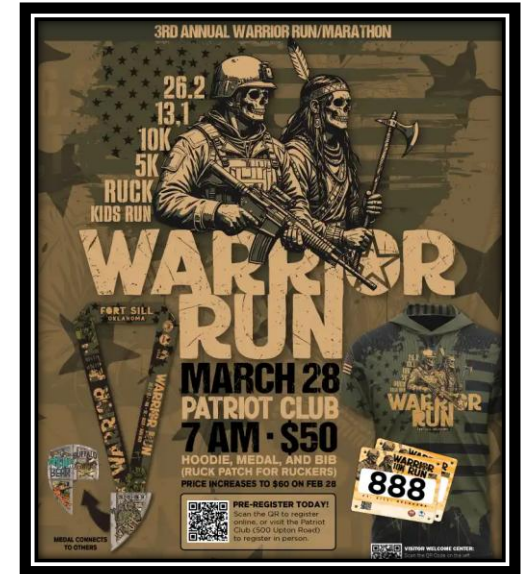
