2025 Installation Commander's Proclamation




October is Fire Prevention Month

Fire Safety Tips

- Test your smoke alarms monthly.
- Create an escape plan and practice it.
- Never leave campfires unattended drown, stir, and feel before leaving.
- Avoid outdoor burning during dry, windy days.
- Keep a hose, water bucket, or shovel nearby when grilling or burning.
- Give space heaters space, at least 3 feet on all sides.

Red Flag Warnings	Burn Bans
Issued by National Weather Service (NWS)	Issued by local or statewide authorities. Check current bans at: www.forestry.ok.gov/burn-ban- information
High fire risk conditions	Restricts campfires, fireworks, and outdoor burning
Avoid any outdoor burning or any activities that create sparks	Violating a ban can result in various legal and financial consequences

Maintaining the Community

- **Trash Containers** Trash containers should be placed out on the curb after 5PM, the evening before the regularly scheduled trash pickup day. Containers must be cleared from the curb area by the end of the day on the day of pick up. It is highly recommended that residents rinse out their trash can with water diluted with bleach, especially during the summer to prevent flying and crawling pests.
- **Fire Pits** The use of resident owned <u>fire pits is prohibited</u>.
- **Dogs** Please use a leash when walking your dog and don't forget to scoop the poop. Dogs need to be on the leash at all timesthe only exception is when they are contained inside the dog park fence and/or your backyard fence.
- **Dog Waste** Tenant is responsible for keeping the grounds clean and sanitary. All yards and common areas mush be kept clean of pet droppings. Tenants must pick up and <u>properly dispose of animal waste</u> and residents who walk their pet must carry a plastic bag to retrieve and dispose of any droppings.
- **Trampolines** Must be installed in the backyard on grassy area, inside the fenced yard. Trampolines are not allowed outside the back yard fence area.
- **Basketball Goals** All portable play equipment, including basketball goals designed for any age group, must be <u>stored in the</u> <u>rear of the home</u>. Equipment must not be visible from the street, common parking areas or primary housing entrances and walkways.
- **Keeping your property clean** Residents are responsible for keeping your yard and surrounding areas (beside, behind and in front of) <u>clean and free of debris and trash</u>.


