On July 23, **Staff Sergeant Matthew McLellan**, Bravo Battery, 2-20th, 75th Field Artillery Brigade, spotted a fire inside a fenced area. As flames, nearly 100 meters in size, advanced toward a nearby fuel truck, he quickly contacted dispatch and used multiple fire extinguishers to hold back the fire until Fort Sill Fire and Emergency Services arrived.

His quick actions prevented the fire from reaching the fuel source and averted a potentially serious incident. Staff Sergeant McLellan's actions reflect great credit on himself, his unit, and Fort Sill.

Black Start Exercise – September 10

Purpose: Readiness drill to validate safety/security procedures, communications, and recovery—not a response to a real event.

Investment in resilience: Third-party assessor will document performance to support funding for critical infrastructure upgrades.

Expectations: Phased power restoration with family housing prioritized; exercise planned for 8 hours, but some areas may take longer to fully restore.

Safety first: Anticipate minor gate delays and traffic control measures—similar to past real-world outages.

Teamwork: Calm leadership, clear communication, and proactive preparation are essential to success.

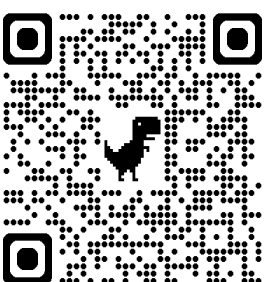

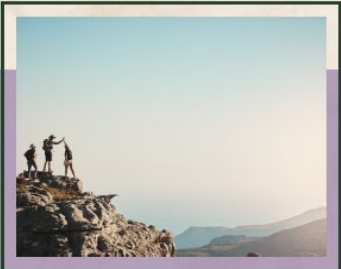

Custodial Service Changes

Beginning Oct. 1, 2025 Custodial Services that are provided by DPW Custodial Contract will be changing per IMCOMs updated funding guidance.

- **Latrine** cleaning will be performed **once per week**
- **Vacuuming** of admin spaces will be performed **once per month**
- **Office trash** removal will be performed **twice per month**
- **Sweeping and mopping floors** will be performed **twice per month**
- **Water fountain** cleaning will be performed **twice per month**

If your trash can is full and needs to be taken out, it is your responsibility to remove your bag and take it to the nearest dumpster. Please do not accumulate bags of office refuse or attempt to dispose of office refuse in the latrines. The contractors will not remove accumulated bags of refuse, and they will not remove the refuse from the latrines if there is anything other than normal latrine refuse.

We understand that these changes come with inconveniences and concerns, but we appreciate your patience and understanding as we all wade through these mandated changes. Moving Out

- **30 days notice** is required to vacate housing. Anything less requires short notice orders given to Corvias within 5 days of issue date to avoid late notice fees.
- **Orders are not required** to put in your Notice to Vacate. If you anticipate orders, let us know immediately and we'll work a timeline to assist you to avoid fees.
- Service member should contact our office to ensure there are no **outstanding fees** for renter's insurance, damages, etc.
- **Schedule a pre-inspection** so that we can walk through the home, approximate damages or ID items that can be repaired by occupant on their own to avoid charges. Also, gives us a better idea of homes with excessive damage that may take longer to turnover, causing delays to incoming servicemembers.

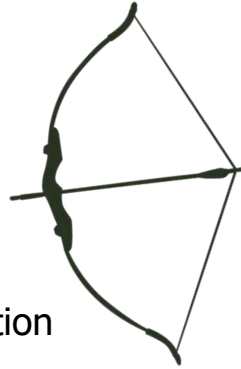
Are your weapons registered?



Anyone wishing to bring or store a Privately Owned Firearm on Fort Sill for authorized legal activities must properly register the firearm at the **Visitor Welcome Center (VWC)**.

✗ Do NOT bring the Weapon into the VWC ✗

- **FS Form 562** can be found on the Visitor Welcome Center (VWC) website, or by going in person to the VWC.
- Fill out all requested information accurately and completely.
- Ensure a working phone number is included on the registration form.
- The firearm registration process can take up to **7 business days** to complete. Please take this into consideration when submitting registration requests.
- **Block 9a and 9b** MUST be completed for all military members and their spouses.
- All personnel applying for firearm(s) registration are subject to an **NCIC background check**.
- Once complete, a Security Assistant will reach out to you letting you know that your registration is ready for pickup.

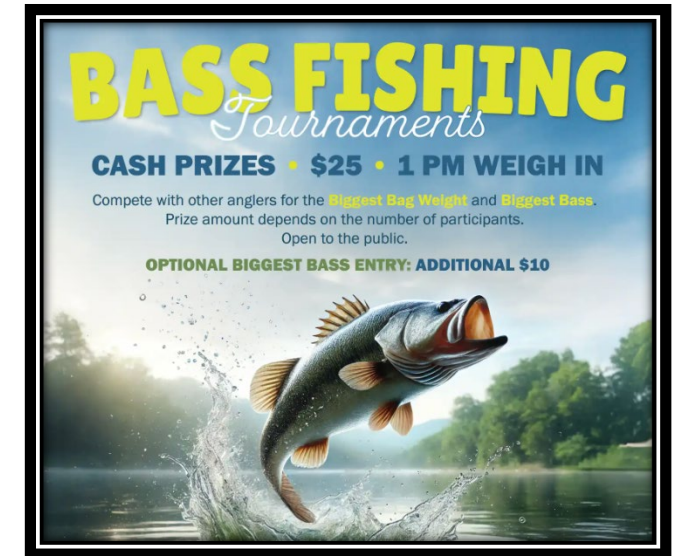
